### **Mission Statement**

### A Moral Revival

On Monday, May 14, I am grateful I had the opportunity to join faith leaders in 36 states to defend the rights of the poor and call for a moral revival in our nation. For the Holy scriptures instruct us: "Speak out for those who cannot speak, for the rights of all the destitute. Speak out, judge righteously, defend the rights of the poor and needy" (Proverbs 31:8-9).

The re-launch of Martin Luther King's Poor People's Campaign will include five more Monday rallies, each calling attention to a specific poverty issue. This week's issue is how poverty affects our most vulnerable citizens: children, women and the disabled.

The prophet Jesus quoted the most, Isaiah, proclaimed: "Doom to you who legislate evil, who make laws that make victims—laws that make misery for the poor, that rob my destitute people of dignity, exploiting defenseless widows, taking advantage of homeless children" (Isaiah 10:1-2).

It is a moral disgrace that in the United States, the world's largest economy, millions of children are homeless, millions more lack adequate food and housing and do not have access to a quality education. Three-quarters of the people living below the poverty line are women and children. Women earn 79 cents to a man's dollar. Ten million women a year are victims of domestic violence. 40 million Americans live with a disability, and in many communities, the disabled do not have access to the services they need.

A nation that doesn't stand for its women, children, and its most vulnerable citizens doesn't stand for anything. Such a nation will not stand tall in the 21<sup>st</sup> century or before God.

We are a stronger nation and our communities are better places to live when we care for our most vulnerable: children, women, and people living with disabilities.

In the words of Fannie Lou Hamer, "It's time for America to get right." *Jarrett*

# Open and Affirming Statement

First Christian Church strives to welcome all people without judgment and to provide a hospitality that affirms the diversity that is the image of God in creation. Each Sunday, when we gather around the Lord's table and say "All are welcome," we truly mean everyone.

When I became your pastor, I made the statement that I believe every church should be "open and affirming," because any church that seeks to follow the teachings of Christ, that seeks to love as he loves, has no business being "closed and condemning."

Of all of the human organizations on this fragmented planet, the church should be a place where all people are welcomed to join a community of grace, love and forgiveness. Without fear of being judged, condemned, or bullied, all people should feel welcomed to come as they are and honestly and openly confess their sinfulness and brokenness. They should then be encouraged to use the gifts God has given them to share the same grace they received with others.

Sadly, this is not the practice of many churches today. Therefore, the proposal is being made to add the following statement to our church's constitution under "Article III: Membership":

"First Christian Church is committed to being a people of grace and welcome to all God's children though differing in race, gender, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, nationality, ethnicity, marital status, physical or mental ability, political stance or theological perspective. We affirm the faith, baptism and spiritual gifts of all Christians celebrating that all people are part of God's good creation." Jarrett

# The History and Importance of Tithing

The "tithe" is mentioned early in the bible, originally in Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. The first tithe was the giving of one-tenth of agricultural produce to the Church (Levite priests). Since the majority of us are not farmers, the tithe was gradually adapted to 10% of one's income. The tithe was initially a required tax, although today it is considered "voluntary." Modern Christians considered the tithe in more spiritual terms, and Matthew 23:23 describes tithing as a requirement for justice, mercy and faithfulness. We are all fortunate enough to be a part of the Disciples of Christ, which has historically given generously to outreach ministries, charities, special offerings, Christian scholarships and anyone in need of financial assistance. It is your tithes that make this tradition of generosity possible, as well as continuing to fund the basic daily operations of our church.
